This class, known as the "Alpha" Class, has set the expectation for all classes that follow. Mr. Draper aspires to obtain a degree in Architecture or Civil Engineering. He has been accepted to Hudson Valley Community College (HVCC). Once he has completed degree requirements at HVCC, he plans to apply to Miami University, Clarkson University, and Howard University in order to reach his desired goal.

Keynote Speaker

Dr. John B. King, Jr. oversees more than 7,000 public and independent elementary and secondary schools (serving 3.1 million students), and hundreds of other educational institutions across New York State including higher education, libraries, and museums. Dr. King is a strong voice for education reform, and he was a driving force in New York's successful Race to the Top application. A former high school teacher and middle school principal, Dr. King has earned a national reputation for his vision and commitment to education reform.

After losing both of his parents to illness by age 12, Dr. King earned a B.A from Harvard University, an M.A. from Teachers College, Columbia University, a J.D. from Yale Law School, and an Ed.D. from Teachers College, Columbia University. In between, he co-founded Roxbury Prep, a top charter middle school in Massachusetts; led Uncommon Schools, a network of charters based in New York; and married and had two daughters.

Under his leadership, Roxbury Prep's students attained the highest state exam scores of any urban middle school in Massachusetts, closed the racial achievement gap, and outperformed students not only from Boston's district schools but also from the state's affluent suburbs. The school raised expectations for poor students, and sought to form close relationships with children while reshaping teaching into a more quantifiable science.

Educational Leadership Award

Shirley Ann Jackson holds a Ph.D. in theoretical elementary particle physics from M.I.T. and an S.B. in physics from M.I.T. Her research specialty is in theoretical condensed matter physics, especially layered systems, and the physics of optoelectronic materials.

In April 2009, U.S. President Barack Obama appointed Dr. Jackson to serve on the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology. PCAST is an advisory group of the nation's leading scientists and engineers who advise the President and Vice President.

Dr. Jackson is co-chair of the President's Innovation and Technology Advisory Committee (PITAC), part of the PCAST. Through PCAST, PITAC advises the President on matters involving science, technology, and innovation policy. President Jackson was appointed to the U.S. Department of State, International Security Advisory Board in July 2011.

Prior to her leadership of Rensselaer, President Jackson was Chairman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission; a theoretical physicist conducting basic research at the former AT&T Bell Laboratories; and a professor of theoretical physics at Rutgers University.

Dr. Jackson is past President of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), and former Chairman of the AAAS Board of Directors.

Applying her skills in teaching, counseling, and administration, she has worked to advance the well-being of the underserved, economically impoverished, and aspiring students. From her early involvement as a Teacher's Aide in the first Head Start program in her hometown of Kansas City, Missouri to her work in the educational arena and community-based activism, she has demonstrated a commitment to helping others become the best that they are capable of becoming.

She has been employed at the University at Albany for the last 20 years, and serves as the Director of the Office of Graduate Student Diversity and Assistant to the Associate Provost-Office of Graduate Studies. Active in the community and her church, she is a member of the Albany District Links, and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.- Delta Mu Omega Chapter. She is a founding member and former Chair of the Black Faculty and Professional Staff Association at the University at Albany, a member of Albany County Civilian Review Board, Schenectady County Community College Advisory Board, Hudson Mohawk Association of Colleges and Universities, and TopFliters Golf League. She sits on WMHT-TV Board of Directors, and is Board member of Two Together, an after-school reading enrichment program for disadvantaged youths.

Additionally, he holds New York State Certifications in Special Education, Elementary Education and School Administration/Supervision.

Rev. Comithier is fully qualified as a preacher, teacher, counselor, pastor and friend. Pastor Comithier developed a Rites of Passage Program which is a faith-based, cultural/social enrichment program designed for youths.

He has retired as Coordinator of Ministerial Services for the New York State Office of Children and Family Services. He is presently the Third Vice President of the Empire Baptist Congress of Christian Education. He has also served as President of the Baptist Ministers Alliance (Capital Area), President of the Baptist Ministers Conference, and Past Moderator of the Hudson River Frontier Missionary Baptist Association. In addition, he is a volunteer staff trainer for the Albany's Camp Opportunities.

Having led the Macedonia Baptist Church of Albany for over 25 years, Pastor Comithier has well-demonstrated his pastoral leadership through discipleship, mentorship, personal community involvement and consistent encouragement to his members as well as to other pastors and churches. Macedonia's commitment to academic excellence was the impetus for the establishment of the Macedonia Scholarship Fund.

Brother Bowie was initiated into Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. at the Upsilon Chapter in the spring of 1961. He has continuously been an active member in this Fraternity since his initiation. He has given over 52 years of service to both the community and the Fraternity. Brother Bowie is one of 10 men who chartered the Albany (NY) Alumni Chapter on December 4, 1971. He has been instrumental in assisting the Chapter continue the traditions of the Fraternity's founders in the areas of community service, fraternalism and achievement in every field of human endeavor.
